The ladies were at a luncheon and afternoon activity as part of the Central District SAR meeting. Robert Howell gave the Ladies Auxiliary report as submitted by Martha Barnhart with primary point being the establishment of a \$200.00 award for the winner of the state JROTC Scholarship

program. Minutes from the 21 July 2007 Summer Meeting were attached to the agenda as distributed and were approved. It was pointed out that the minutes were NOT a transcript of the proceedings but the Secretary's notes. It was also noted that in order to conserve time for floor discussion the various reports submitted to President Howell were included in synoptic format within the agenda. All present thought that was a good idea and only "last minute" items would be added by the individual when called upon by the President. (see attached agenda dated 27 October 2007). Reports were taken in order on the Agenda. Of note under District 6, Director Willard Waterson reported encouraging progress on re-establishing a Chapter in Northwest Indiana but questioned which district to assign the Chapter once reactivated. Also discussed was the inactivity/demise of the Seth Jewel Chapter in Auburn. A discussion of the Madison Indiana Patriot Grave ceremony ensued and T. Rex Legler II stated that a number of applications had ensued and that a Southeastern Indiana Chapter was looming on the horizon.

Under Old Business Steve Oberlin reiterated that a new "user friendly" Chapter website format was available and that he or Wade Harshman could "assist" a chapter webmaster get up and running. President Howell again stated that there was a current vacancy for Editor, Hoosier Patriot. Also discussion ensued regarding the timeframe of transition from present State Secretary Jack E. Moore who had tendered a resignation as of 31 December 2007 and incoming State Secretary William E. Sharp. As various members had received different inputs, it was determined that President Howell would be in contact with Jack Moore to clarify and ensure as best a possible a seamless transition and timely submission of membership roster and dues to NSSAR. Finally under old business T. Rex Legler II reported that the "Indiana Society SAR Service Medal" had been approved by NSSAR Medals & Awards Committee and the NSSAR Executive Committee. Legler stated he would now seek bids from suppliers for presentation at the January 2008 State Meeting in Indianapolis. Concern was raised by Robert E. Burton regarding notification to members about this award prior to its submission to national for approval. Discussion ensued and Compatriot Burton was assured by Compatriot Bragg and others that all constitutional requirements regarding a floor motion, discussion, and vote had been met at the 21 July 2007 Summer Meeting in Evansville and that no "railroading" had occurred. It was also pointed out that further discussion would be held in January when the financial aspect would need to be included in the 2008 Budget proposal for floor vote at the April 2008 annual State Congress in Muncie.

The Saturday, 19 January 2007 meeting was announced. Host Chapter is Clarence A. Cook and details will be forthcoming on the INSSAR website and, hopefully, Hoosier Patriot. The Benediction was conducted by Douglas Wellman and the SAR Recessional was led by G. Thomas Schnuck. The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 PM by President Howell.

*Report: At the NSSAR September Fall Leadership/Trustees Meeting, 60+ committees presented reports. A new Member Services Committee will work on commercial affinity agreements (credit cards, travel clubs, etc.) to generate yield revenue for the SAR without cost or risk. The NSSAR Education Director is leading the Society's outreach education program to answer the need for patriotic education in our nation. NSSAR hired a Development Director to lead fundraising efforts for the Center for Advancing America's Heritage.

The President General advanced a proposal for study to relocate the NSSAR Headquarters by purchasing a five-story building downtown at 8th and Main in the center of a developing museum district. This would consolidate Headquarters and CAAH in one building.

An SAR trip to Scotland is planned for May 2008 and to France in September to mark the 225th anniversary of the Treaty of Paris ending the Revolutionary War.
