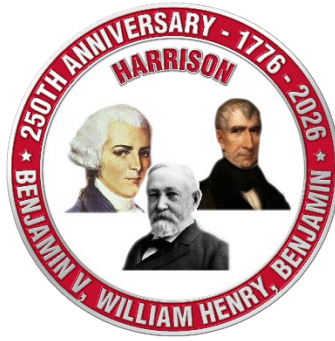

2024 Central District Challenge Coin

Benjamin Harrison V - An American planter, merchant, and politician who played a significant role in colonial Virginia during the American Revolution. Born on April 5, 1726, in Charles City County, Virginia, he followed the tradition of public service set by his namesakes. Harrison was educated at the College of William and Mary and became a legislator, representing both Surry County and Charles City County in the Virginia House of Burgesses. His legacy extends beyond his legislative work. Benjamin Harrison V was a signer of the *Continental Association* and one of the *Founding Fathers* of the United States. He also signed the *United States Declaration of Independence*. His commitment to liberty and equality is evident in the Declaration's famous words: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

William Henry Harrison - American military officer and politician who served as the ninth president of the United States. Born on February 9, 1773, in Charles City County, Virginia. *His father, Benjamin Harrison V, was a U.S. Founding Father.* His military career thrust him into the national limelight. He played key roles in the Northwest Indian War (with General Anthony Wayne at Fallen Timbers), including the Battle of Tippecanoe, and later served as the Governor of the Indiana Territory. His leadership during these campaigns showcased his dedication to public service. Tragically, Harrison's presidency was the shortest in U.S. history. He took office on March 4, 1841, but succumbed to enteric fever just 31 days later, on April 4, 1841. His untimely death caused a constitutional crisis, as presidential succession wasn't fully defined at the time. Harrison remains a unique figure—*the last president born as a British subject in the Thirteen Colonies* and the grandfather of Benjamin Harrison, who would become the 23rd U.S. president. His final days were spent in Washington, D.C., where he passed away.

Benjamin Harrison - An American politician who served as the 23rd president of the United States from 1889 to 1893. Born on August 20, 1833, in North Bend, Ohio, he hailed from the prominent Harrison family. His lineage included his grandfather, the ninth president, William Henry Harrison, and his great-grandfather, Benjamin Harrison V, a Founding Father. After graduating from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, Benjamin Harrison moved to Indianapolis, Indiana. There, he established himself as a prominent local attorney, a leader in the Presbyterian church, and a respected politician. His commitment to civil rights and efforts to promote American commerce and industry were notable during his political career.

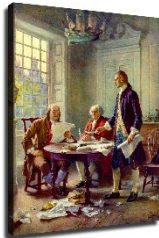


2024 Central District Raffle
